**Programs details:**

**Project SNOW 6<sup>th</sup> grade:**

Students learn to snowshoe and discover the winter environment at Mt. Bachelor. Students use field based and experiential approach in science inquiry to assess nivean environments; using snow tools, animal tracking and seasonal adaptation studies. Students address physical, life and earth science standards as well as winter safety and preparedness.

**Preparedness:**

- Snowshoe hike 1.25 mile in length (Snow Science may have less hiking time)
- Approximately 2 hours to snowshoe the entire route
- Typically below freezing temperatures (check weather reports that day)
- Wear warm, waterproof boots, layered clothing, snow pants, winter coat, hat and gloves
- Snow depth can vary; expect uneven surfaces and snow terrain

→ Sack lunch and full water bottle (lunches can be purchased from Nutrition Services for \$3.00 or you can get one if you receive free/reduced lunch)

\*\*Adult chaperones are also needed. Please contact the office about how to get cleared to join!

*\*\*Please note, we are experiencing a low snowpack at the time, we may incorporate more forestry/wildlife studies into our field days.*
